specify how long you have been	I was admitted to the Institute as a member in 2010 and served on the Elections Committee in 2012-2015. In 2016, I was privileged to be elected Director and contribute to the activity of the IISL Board, having attended all its meetings and the Institute's

In particular, I was working on the Membership Initiative aimed at engaging more space enthusiasts in the IISL family, improving relationship between the Institute and its Members, and encouraging internal communications. After the most workable action items were selected by the Board, the launch of the Institute's new Membership Initiative was announced at the last General Assembly meeting and started to be implemented. For the promotion of the Institute's activity in the region of my origin, a few local IISL events, both formal and informal, were arranged in Moscow and become regular. These include the Annual All-Russian Meeting of the International Institute of Space Law, which is a platform to gather IISL members from Russia and those from other countries who are currently based in Russia, and IISL Space Happy Hours for casual networking. This experience can be tailored to other locations and utilized globally, including other CIS countries which are my forward plan to ensure the Institute's geographical growth. During the current term of office, I have recruited more than fifteen new IISL members. Since 2011, I have been annually participating in the IISL Colloquia on the Law of Outer Space and have contributed by delivering papers to other IISL conferences, including the Eilene M. Galloway Symposium, the IISL/ECSL Symposium, and the IISL Space Law Workshop at Colorado Springs Space Symposium. For the Manfred Lachs Space Law Moot Court Competition, I am judging memorials and attract new teams to the European regional round. In 2016, when I was elected IISL Director, no Russian teams participated in the Moot Court Competition. For the 2019 competition, four Russian teams have been registered.</p>
<p>specify your expertise and activities in space law or other social science aspects maximum length 500 words</p>	<p>Since 2005, I have been working with the Intersputnik International Organization of Space Communications. My current position as the Head of International and Legal Service helps accumulate academic knowledge and practical experience in satellite telecommunications, with a particular focus on the use of radio-frequency spectrum and satellite orbits, and space law, both international and national. Among the latest achievements in this field, Intersputnik's acceptance in 2018 of the rights and obligations under the Rescue Agreement, the Liability Convention, and the Registration Convention as well as the obligation to comply with the Outer Space Treaty, can be mentioned. Since 2008, I have been serving as Intersputnik's representative before the UN COPUOS Legal Subcommittee's sessions; in 2015, I was a member of Intersputnik's delegation to the ITU World Radiocommunication Conference. Besides my full-time job at Intersputnik, I am involved in a few international projects in the field of space law. These include serving as an associate editor and one of the core experts in the MILAMOS Project (Manual on International Law Applicable to Military Uses of Outer Space) and as a member of the Legal Council at For All Moonkind, Inc. whose mission is to ensure recognition and protection of human heritage in outer space. As part of cooperation with academia, I review the curricula of Russian universities and give, upon request, guest lectures on different aspects of space law, satellite communications, and international organizations.</p>

I would like to see IISL as an authoritative global organization with a recognized professional expertise in the field of space law and I would be honoured to personally contribute to achieving this, inter alia, by participating in IISL's researches and studies, providing practical and legal input into areas of contemporary concern within my competences, and arranging space-related events. Due to my origin, I am particularly interested in increasing the degree of the IISL's presence in Russia and other CIS countries by encouraging new members to join the world space law community and attracting young professionals to the IISL activity.</p>

In 2005, I joined the Intersputnik International Organization of Space Communications – an intergovernmental organization established in 1971 with headquarters in Moscow and uniting twenty-six Member States, a permanent observer to the UN COPUOS and a member of the ITU Radiocommunication Sector – where I worked my way up from a lawyer to Head of International and Legal Service. I am currently in charge of legal support of Intersputnik's activity and international cooperation matters. For the purpose of capacity building, I have established and supervise a regular internship programme at the International and Legal Service of Intersputnik for students and young professionals where they can gain useful knowledge and practical experience in the field of international space law and satellite communications.</p>
